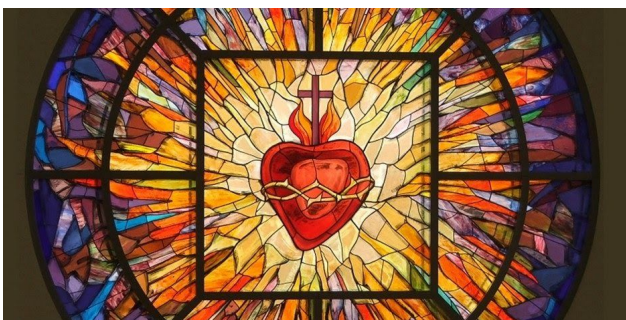
Parent Association Announcements

School Re-Opening Plan to address COVID-19

As we plan for the 2020-21 School Year: Our primary goal is to provide the highest quality education possible for all Holy Family students, academically, socially-emotionally, and spiritually. We will be following best practices for ensuring student health and safety which includes drafting a plan for meeting Department of Health continuously updated guidelines.

Some of the feedback from those 10 families:

- *More than one third of families would not be able to start school before September 2, which is enough for us to not consider this as an option.
- *Most families will need some sort of afternoon extended care.
- *Some families will continue to need morning extended care.

Some comments about the Distance Learning that took place last quarter included:

“I think the school did a great job navigating the difficult circumstances. I appreciate how helpful all of the teachers were.”

“For my family, having a blended source of resources is very helpful.”

“We really appreciate all the effort from HFS to keep the kids learning. If we do go online again, having a virtual school mass would be wonderful.”

In general, families had very constructive feedback that we intend to use for our Alternative Emergency plan which we pray we do not have to use because we have small class sizes and all classes should be able to continue at school in person. Even if we never have to go back to total Distance Learning, the positive lessons we learned about communication and virtual community building will be folded into how we better meet the needs of all students.
